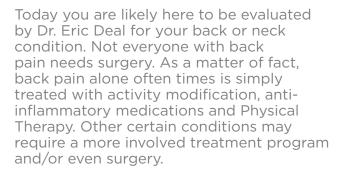

After being evaluated today, various treatment options may be recommended, including:

- Medication
- Physical Therapy
- X-rays
- CT Scan
- MRI
- Injections

It is important that you as a patient are involved in your treatment program and try your best to complete these recommendations. We will try to get you feeling better with the least invasive treatments first. If these do not improve symptoms to your satisfaction, only then will we order more tests and increase the level of treatments.

By exploring non-invasive options and following a well-documented treatment path, it becomes more likely that your insurance provider will reimburse for more involved treatments that might be necessary. Following the recommended treatment plan can ultimately expedite the process and decrease costs.



If Physical Therapy is recommended, it is a critical part of your treatment plan. It alone may be enough to help improve your condition. In cases where Physical Therapy does not improve symptoms, following the progression in treatment mandated by insurance providers makes it easier to move forward with advanced imaging or injections.
